- Increase knowledge of complex trauma and symptoms of trauma in children.
- Develop skills for addressing the impact of trauma on children.
- Learn techniques for caregivers and child interviews.
- understand principles for individual clinical assessment and treatment of traumatized children.
- Identify the effects of working with traumatized children on clinicians and review strategies for using a model of self-care.

Through a combination of lectures, tutorials and case discussions, participants will become familiar with clinical assessment and treatment of children who have been affected by trauma. Current literature on clinical work with children exposed to trauma and domestic violence will be reviewed.
